For those that have not taken MICROECONOMIC THEORY B, I would imagine that this class is excellent; but for those that have, I'd imagine the only new topic they would learn would be Regression analysis. I would've liked to have studied some case studies of actual firms using Microeconomic theory. Awesome Instructor.
- Steve explains things pretty well. He goes a lot into deriving formulas in class, which is understandable, but sometimes it is easy to get lost and not knowing whether he is deriving or actually showing us the formulas or how to approach to solving a problem. It should be helpful if we can do more sample problems to become more familiar with how the formulas can be used to solving problems.
- Great prof. One of the best business professors at UCR. Sometimes during the lecture he would get to technical when it came to the math of certain things but that could just be my own fault not necessarily his fault.
- I felt that sometimes he spent a lot of time in class doing more calculus than economics. He would put questions on the homework that we didn't cover in class. However he did have a lot of opportunities for extra credit, and was helpful during office hours or if you asked him questions.
- Was a very interesting class because Steve knew his stuff. He did go a little fast in lecture, but other than that he was a very good teacher for this course.
- instructor knew the material extremely well; taught the class and answered questions without notes. would be helpful to go over more problems in class similar to those on the homework and exams

- Has EXTREMELY HIGH expectations of students. Very difficult course.
- VERY NICE. MAKE THE PROBLEM SETS EASIER TO UNDERSTAND
- Prof Levkoff shows great enthusiasm for the subject esp game theory. His lectures are hard to follow, lacks clarification. I think just a little more clarity on definitions and concepts with examples would help especially if it's types up so students can follow the lectures better. Prof Levkoff's class is challenging but he is fair in how in grades.
- Please talk slower, sometimes it sounds like mumbling.
- This professor is by far one of the hardest that I had, and because of that I learned so much from him. I just hope he can keep up that level of teaching in the future because I never learned more before
- I felt like most of the questions on the test were not properly covered in lecture. Steve focused more on proving theories than to show us how to utilize them which made solving the homework and test questions very difficult. In the sections where examples were given by him in lecture, I understood far better than those which were not given examples. Tests were stressful and hard to study for because I did not know how to solve them most of the time because I had not been given the tools to interpret the question and how to utilize the material in order to solve them. When there are questions that the TA cannot solve or does not know how to solve, I feel it is unfair and harder to get help. Several times homework questions or reviews of the midterms left the TA unable to answer because she was not able to solve them either, that is discouraging for a student like myself who was already struggling in the class. Steve is very knowledgeable in the material, but I think he needs to find a way to communicate the material in an easier way to the class.
- Professor assumed that all students were well prepared for the course. As an economics class, most of the students were econ-majors. As a business student, I lacked the prior information and experience that the professor expected from everyone.

OR at least randomly distribute test versions, to get a better determination of real average to base the curve off of.

- I really enjoyed your class and the enthusiasm you brought to it through your examples. I especially like how you have, so far, avoided a clear political stance. That is something some professors make obvious when they talk about the economy or policy. The only advice I would give you is that sometimes when you speak to the class you can use really complicated words. To me it makes you seem intimidating and unapproachable. You must remember that we are not as prepared as you, even if we may understand you. Using simpler words may get the message across more easily. Other than that, you were a great professor.
- Professor Levkoff is one of the best professors I have in UCR. Really clear and understanding. Also was very helpful during his office hours, I hope he will be teaching more often.
- The exams were too hard and did not necessarily reflect what we learned in class. Some questions were tricky, and I don't think that was necessary to assess how much we understand the material. The assignments however were helpful.

I think we spend too much time looking at the power point and might have missed out of your usual teaching. Still, you are a great professor, keep up the good work!
- When we made the transition to power point slides, I thought it would be helpful if the slides were up prior to lecture. I feel that it is easier to listen to the lecture and take additional notes if we had the slides first.
- Teaches like TA. Toward the end of the quarter, he was getting lazy. Just reads off the slides! I like it better when he writes on the board. He said it himself that quizzes are given in discussion, however, it turns out that there are no quizzes in discussion. Instead, they are given in classes. I also felt that pop quizzes weigh too much. It is the same as homework. In my own opinion, I don't understand true essence of pop quizzes. The grade on pop quizzes only reflects if that student came to class that day and whether or not you know the material at that point. If you don't know the material at that point doesn't mean you don't know it. I attend class regularly and I get really low score on pop quizzes. Does that mean you are not an effective professor? In addition, he can't take the fact that he can be wrong too. There is one homework question he did incorrectly, and I pointed out to him and he asked me to read the question more carefully. In addition, by now, everyone knows how to calculate NPV. I can't believe he spends one week on this topic.
- Mr. Levkoff has a great understanding of the material and parlayed that into an interesting learning experience with practical anecdotes. First part of the course was at a more manageable pace. When the lectures switched to a more Powerpoint-centric format, the slides were read quickly, often with not a lot of time to absorb the concepts. The slides were put up later for further review, but it was still too fast. The instructor spent a good amount of time making sure students could comprehend the calculations and theory behind many of the concepts, which was helpful.
- Dr. Levkoff is one of the best professors I've had at UCR. His lectures were clear, and more of a conversation with the class than just straight lecturing. I really felt like he connected to the class on a deeper level than most other professors I've had here. Great job, Prof Levkoff!
- He seems that he doesn't want to teach this class. It makes me feel like he just gives the lecture directly out from the textbook. He doesn't know how the things "really" work, maybe it's because he lacks experience in working in the financial sector. Otherwise there will not be that many questions about definition and going over history in the class. I don't know what he's doing in class and I don't know what the class is really about. His midterm questions are based on the materials he covered in 20 minutes in class. He expects his TA will go over the materials he didn't go over in class but his TA does a very poor job.
